












orn on 1st April 1942 at village 'Tatiri' in the district Baghpat (earlier Meerut) of Uttar Pradesh to late Shri Ram Kishan ji and late Smt. Mono Devi, he is the eldest among the four siblings (three brothers and one sister). He obtained his early education up to 8th standard in the High Schools in villages 'Tera' and 'Kamala Jud' while living at his maternal uncle's village Titroada. From 9th standard onwards, he moved to a small town Baraut about 18 km from his native village and had his education from 9-12th standard at the Janta Vedic Inter College with 8th position in UP Board and further BSc (Ag) and MSc (Agril Botany) from the Janta Vedic PG College, Baraut, Dist. Baghpat and obtained Ist position in the college, 7th position in the University, and bagged Chancellor's Medal for being one of the two best students of all the affiliated colleges/campuses of Agra University,

Agra in 1962. Though his village was well connected with rail and road transport and it was easy to have daily up and down for attending the classes from home but he with firm determination preferred to stay in the town all alone so that he can concentrate on his studies. It is indeed a matter of great courage for a boy of 16 years to stay away from parents alone by taking a room on rent in the town and making food arrangement in a students' mess.

Although his parents were not educated and engaged in farming but were keen that their children must get proper education and hence always encouraged them. After graduation, his parents were not keen that he should pursue higher education due to financial constraints on account of severe damage to the crops in the field due to bad weather. He realized the situation and decided not to put burden on his parents and started looking for jobs. He attended two interviews for Lecturer's position in different Inter Colleges but was not selected and instead the

Selection Boards advised him to pursue higher studies in view of his being highly meritorious and topper in the college. Perhaps, there was something else in his destiny.

One day, he got an inland letter from a close relative in Delhi to get him 'Admission Form' from Janta Vedic Degree College, Baraut and when he went to Baraut to get the admission form, he also met Shri Bhanwar Singh Rana who was his close friend and one year senior in the college studying in MSc (Ag) final. BS Rana insisted him to accompany him to the college and meet his classmates. Although he declined, BS Rana prevailed and took him to his class. The Head of the Department of the Agricultural Botany came to know that I was sitting in the class, he called me and asked why you have not taken admission in spite of being topper in the college. Hehonestly expressed to the Head of the Department that he does not want any financial burden on his parents. Although the last date of admissions was over by one day, the Head of the Department was very keen about this admission in his department and he earnestly requested the Principal and got him admitted in back date. He unwillingly took admission in MSc (Agril. Botany) without the consent of parents. When he went back home and informed the parents about admission, they were initially very unhappy but later not only encouraged but fully supported him.

After getting the MSc (Agril. Botany) degree, he wished to take admission for PhD degree in the ICAR-IARI, New Delhi but later dropped the idea due to financial constraints and instead, joined as 'Assistant Professor' in Janta Vedic College, Baraut. But he soon realized that there was not much scope of progress in teaching profession in the college and then he applied for the post of 'Senior Research Assistant' in the Plant Introduction Division, ICAR-IARI, and got selected through UPSC and joined at ICAR-IARI Plant Introduction Station at Jodhpur (Rajasthan). None in the family was supportive of his moving to Jodhpur which was heavily bombarded during Indo-Pak war in 1965-66. Dr Bhag Mal then, seriously thought over and analysed the pros and cons especially in view of his career progress and finally decided to join at Jodhpur. After about two years, he applied and got selected for the post of 'Junior Agrostologist' at the ICAR-Central Arid Zone Research Institute (CAZRI), Jodhpur and also for the post of 'Assistant Plant Improvement Officer' at the ICAR-IGFRI and finally looking into scope and his research area of

interest he moved to ICAR-IGFRI, Jhansi in the year 1968. He was very firm in his mind that without PhD degree, it is difficult to make further progress and hence moved to the Regional Station of Plant Introduction Division at Amravati (Maharashtra) as 'Junior Botanist' in 1973 keeping in mind that after two years, he will be eligible for admission in PG School, ICAR-IARI New Delhi as a part-time candidate and it so happened that after two years, he got selected topping the list of selected candidates for PhD admission and was accordingly transferred from Amravati to New Delhi. In the meantime, he was selected as Plant Breeder (Senior Class I post) at the ICAR-IGFRI, Jhansi (Uttar Pradesh). Then, he was in a great dilemma whether to continue PhD or join at Jhansi. He consulted the Head and other senior colleagues in the Division and every one advised him to avail this opportunity which may not be possible so soon even after being PhD, and finally, he moved to ICAR-IGFRI, Jhansi. Besides excellence in fodder research, he continued his efforts for pursuing PhD program and discussed with the then Director who made him the Chairman of the Committee to get ICAR-IGFRI Jhansi affiliated with Jiwaji University, Gwalior and finally, he completed his long-awaited dream of acquiring PhD degree from Jiwaji University, Gwalior in the year 1985.

I would like to mention that one of his close relative Shri Naresh Verma ji expressed him as-

उनके व्यक्तित्व में शिक्षा, ज्ञान और सेवा की त्रिमूर्ति का वास है। शायद इसी कारण जब मैंने उनसे अपने गांव में लड़कियों की शिक्षा की दशा पर बात की तो उन्होंने कहा की यह समाज के लिए बहुत जरूरी है कि ग्रामीण लड़कियों को शिक्षा दी जाए। उनसे बात करके मेरा मनोबल बढ़ा और हमने ठाना की फजलपुर बागपत में केवल लड़कियों के लिए एक स्कूल खोला जाए और हमने एक ट्रस्ट बनाया। इस ट्रस्ट के न केवल निर्माण अपितु उसको आगे बढ़ाने के लिए आज तक निरंतर डॉ. भागमल जी तन, मन और धन से सहयोग कर रहे हैं। पूसा संस्थान में वैज्ञानिक होने के बावजूद अपने व्यस्ततम समय में से समय निकालकर हमारे आग्रह पर नवंबर 2010 से नवंबर 2015 तक 'शांति देवी कन्या इंटर कॉलेज, फजलपुर, बागपत' के चेयरमैन के दायित्व का निर्वाह किया। इस बीच वे निरंतर स्कूल में जाते रहे और कैसे उस इंटर कालेज की लड़कियों का सर्वांगीण विकास हो, इसके बारे में सोचते रहे।"

One more point, on family front, after the death of his younger brother due to throat cancer, he happily shouldered the responsibility of his family and small children until they were fully grownup and started earning on their own, including marriage of his niece, apart other support.

As a Project Coordinator, AICRP on Underutilized and Under-Exploited Plants, he successfully managed and coordinated the activities of the project which resulted in the development of several improved varieties and production technologies of these crops.

In addition, he had also been given the responsibility of implementing the USAID Project at the ICAR-NBPGR (1989-1994). He executed the project activities of infrastructure development, collaborative research and training of scientists and technicians, and visits of around 100 scientists and technicians in different laboratories in the US under the HRD component of the Indo-US PGR Project. His contribution at the PIU to monitor the construction of National Genebank/ICAR-NBPGR Hqrs building under the overall leadership of Dr RS Paroda/Dr RS Rana, is a memorable one. This amply demonstrated his coordination and managerial skills. He was also entrusted with the responsibility as Assistant Director General (Seed) and Assistant Director

After serving the national system in different capacities, he received an opportunity to serve as Coordinator, IPGRI (now Bioversity International) and as Interim Executive Secretary, APAARI in the international system, where he also left his footprints.

While working at the ICAR-Indian Grassland and Fodder Research Institute (ICAR-IGFRI) and at the ICAR-NBPGR, he made very significant contributions in fodder crops and underutilized plants research and development. During his professional career, he developed six (6) forage crops varieties and contributed for evolving ten (10) varieties of underutilized crops. Also, he has been instrumental in the implementation and coordination of important international projects such as Indo-UK Forage Project, Indo-Australian Project, ADB funded Tropical Fruits Project in 10 countries, ACIAR funded Project on Conservation of Tropical Fruit Species Germplasm in five countries, IFAD-NUS Project on Small millets, etc. apart Indo-USAID PGR Project.

Another important facet of Dr Bhag Mal's personality is his enormous scientific experience and wisdom. Despite so many achievements in the field of genetics and plant breeding, he always remained humble and unassuming. His contributions in the areas of biodiversity conservation, characterization and utilization, genetics and breeding of fodder crops and underutilized crops, agro-forestry etc. will always remain important. He is not only an excellent scientist, but a great research manager, administrator, and institution builder. His ability to manage many complex situations even under the times of stress with professional handling, balanced mind and cool temperament made him rise so high in his career.



cientific organization's administration and management differs in many ways. A leader for such organization needs to be the best amalgamation of strong technical background and administrative acumen. Dr Bhag Mal is a person with amalgamation of such rare qualities. Many of us worked/working at ICAR-IGFRI, Jhansi encountered with this great persona when he was serving in IGFRI as Head of Crop Improvement Division and subsequently as Director (Jan, 1996 to April, 1998). Back then with no access to information, as we now can browse and access information just by a mouse click, he was a source of information and knowledge to the scientific community of IGFRI. A man with bundle of knowledge, many times discussions with him paved ways for new ideas and/or helped to re-orient research methods for better outcomes. His first priority was always for scientific discussions irrespective of administrative work load and time period. He always encouraged scientists to have exposure of the best facilities/infrastructure available in forge research in the world. I still remember providing opportunities to 12 scientists and 3 technical staff to visit UK in a single year 1997. Additionally, the year 1997-98 was marked by several important milestones resulting in more output-oriented programs namely two varieties, one each in berseem (Bundel Berseem-2) and Oat (Bundel Jai-2), creation of three new units, viz., Consultancy Cell, PRA Cell and HRD unit, and formulation of Perspective Plan envisaging visionary approach up to 2020.

During his tenure, FAO has recognized the ICAR-IGFRI as its training centre and an International Training Program on Management and Utilization of Fodder Trees/Shrubs in Sub-tropical and Temperate Himalaya was executed during September 1997. Similarly, ICRA, The Netherlands has agreed to have joint field study with IGFRI. The Indo-Australian ACIAR project on *Stylosanthes* was finalized wherein I was personally involved and my nomination by him to be PI of the project (Improved resistance component) and later I had exposure of working at CSIRO, Australia has immensely helped shaping my future. Still, I am indebted to him for this wonderful scientific opportunity.

I remember him as ever smiling, cool and calm person. He was easily approachable and always had time to listen to the concerns of scientists. There are umpteen examples where I approached him and took his suggestions for furthering our research as well as career. He is a role model not for one but for generations of scientists. Besides, the encouragement


I perceive great feeling while talking to him. The time spent with this great human being is ever etched in my mind and heart. I wish him a happy and healthy life.

Rare Amalgam of Academic and Human Excellence

r Bhag Mal has contributed immensely as a plant breeder, scientist and research manager, both at national and international levels. I had the first opportunity to meet Dr Bhag Mal way back in 1988. I was doing my Masters in Botany at the University of Delhi, and my teacher (and subsequent PhD guide) late Professor HY Mohan Ram took us to the visit National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources (NBPGR), as part of our course on "Plants for Humans". Dr RK Arora was Director (Acting) and he had introduced us about activities under the 'All India Coordinated Research Project on Underutilized Crops', besides other divisions and programs. Dr Bhag Mal was the National Coordinator and he provided a brief overview of the work being undertaken under the AICRP (UUP). Back then I remember my first impression about Dr Bhag Mal was his cheerful disposition and affable nature. This impression was reiterated later when I joined ICAR-NBPGR in February 1994 as a Scientist, after completing my six-months training as an ARS inductee at ICAR-NAARM, Hyderabad. By this time, Dr Bhag Mal had the additional responsibility of heading the Project Implementation Unit, Indo-USAID PGR project, under which most scientists of the ICAR-NBPGR were sent for training abroad to acquire specialized subject matter training for 3-6 months. Not surprisingly Dr Bhag Mal was a much sought-after person, as he along under the leadership of then Directors of NBPGR, Padma Bhushan Dr RS Paroda and Dr RS Rana, ran the Indo-USAID project very successfully, benefitting almost all the scientists of NBPGR present in the duration of the project (1989-94).

Thereafter, Dr Bhag Mal left NBPGR to work at ICAR Hqrs/ICAR-IGFRI, Jhansi and later as South Asia Coordinator, Bioversity International (formerly, International Plant Genetic Resources Institute), Sub-regional Office for South Asia, New Delhi (1998-2007). During this period, I again got opportunity to work and interact with him under the 'Centre of Excellence for Training on *in vitro* Conservation and Cryopreservation' identified by the ICAR and Bioversity International. Three trainings were held during this period by the NBPGR (2002, 2006, 2007) supported by Bioversity International, under his coordination. His networking skills were very useful in inviting subject matter experts and trainees from more than 30 countries, making each of these trainings much sought-after and very successful.

Dr Bhag Mal has contributed in organization of many Seminars/Symposia/Conferences during his long and illustrious career. I had the opportunity to work closely in two instances. Dr Bhag Mal became the President of the Indian Society of Plant Genetic Resources (ISPGR) during 2007-2009



and I was the Joint Secretary. He took several initiatives to improve the functioning of the Society, including the induction of 'Fellows' and reframing the constitution. A major achievement was holding of National Symposium on 'Recent Global Developments in the Management of Plant Genetic Resources', organized jointly by the ISPGR and NBPGR at New Delhi. The meeting attracted more than 400 participants from the country and was a great success. Dr Bhag Mal displayed great leadership qualities and remained calm and composed even in very difficult situations that arise during the organization of such meetings. More recently (2016), when the 1st International Agrobiodiversity Congress (IAC, 2016) was organized under the dynamic vision and leadership of Dr RS Paroda, I was associated as the Member Secretary of the Core Organizing Committee. Dr Bhag Mal, then working with APAARI, was Member of the Technical and Publication Committee. I recall how he patiently provided his inputs and guidance, even under stressful and difficult situations. His biggest asset is to provide editing input in write-ups and documents, in the shortest period.

In fact, I got to closely learn about his editorial capabilities in two documents developed in the recent past. First was the 'Guidelines for Management of Plant Genetic Resources in India' published in 2016 where he was the Committee Chair and Dr RK Tyagi, then Head, Division of Conservation Division, ICAR-NBPGR was Member Secretary. The document took a long time to be developed and Dr Bhag Mal provided guidance in his usual patient manner. It was rewarding that the Guidelines were released by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Sh. Narendra Modi ji, during the inaugural function of IAC 2016. The second was the 'Report on Policies and Action Plan for a Secure and Sustainable Agriculture' developed for the Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India, which was submitted in 2019. The report was developed by a multidisciplinary team (including myself) under the Chairmanship of Dr Paroda. While multiple drafts were churned out, Dr Bhag Mal along with Dr Umesh Srivastava made sure that all corrections and suggestions were suitably incorporated in each draft, with his usual critical manner!

What is impressive about Dr Bhag Mal is that his commitment towards progress of science is apparent from the fact that he continues to work with passion even at a young age of 80. We congratulate him on achieving this milestone and wish him many more years of happiness and health so that he continues to serve Society as he is currently doing as Secretary of the TAAS. Age is barely a concern as long as one has curiosity in mind and love in the heart, and Dr Bhag Mal is endowed with both.

t is my privilege and honor to express some of my feelings and impressions about Dr Bhag Mal whom I have been associated with over the last three decades. When I was moving from ICAR-CRRI (now ICAR-NRRI) Cuttack, I was advised by my senior colleagues to contact Dr Bhag Mal, the then Project Coordinator (UU&UEP), ICAR-NBPGR, for his support. After I joined ICAR-NBPGR in 1988, I noticed that he was very affectionate towards juniors, despite being a very senior person. After observing his kind behaviour, I often took the liberty of seeking his help and guidance on various research aspects. He was considerate enough to spare his valuable time and advised me on numerous aspects of my thesis work. Hence, I am highly grateful to him for providing me with support in the time of need.

Dr Bhag Mal has been a very capable scientist and research manager. t is a pleasure to write about Dr Bhag Mal, whom I idolize, both professionally as well as personally, on the occasion of commemoration of his eightieth birthday. Dr Bhag Mal joined the ICAR-NBPGR, New Delhi as the first Project Coordinator of All India Coordinated Research Project on Under Utilized and Under Exploited Plants (UU&UEP) in March 1987. At that time, the NBPGR was organizing an international symposium on Life Support Plant Species. I had the privilege of sharing my table with him while he was waiting for procurement of office furniture and I was waiting for space to relocate to create space for the Project Coordinator's office. Unassuming person as he is, Dr Bhag Mal did not mind sharing space with a junior most scientist. Being a dedicated worker, he started working late hours right from day one. Successful organization of the symposium and bringing out a book on its proceedings was probably Dr Bhag Mal's first assignment at the NBPGR New Delhi.

My next lesson came immediately after the symposium when Dr Bhag Mal brought out the First Annual Report of the Coordinated Project on UU&UEP without any assistance from a statistician or staff of Project Coordinating Unit and successfully organized the annual workshop of the coordinated project. During the Seventh Five Year Plan, Dr Bhag Mal gave direction to the Coordinated Project and prioritized different groups of plants for undertaking research at various centres. Realizing the constraints in funding of centres outside the agricultural research system, Dr Bhag Mal added eight new SAU based centres during the Eighth Five Year Plan. He also paved the way for shift in focus from perennial plants to annual crops. This foresight led to promotion of rice bean to the National Pulse Improvement Program and recognition of faba bean and pseudo cereals as important contributors to hill agriculture later on. Some people call underutilized (now called potential crops) as orphan crops. These crops will not be orphaned as long as people like Dr Bhag Mal are there to champion their cause.

Simultaneously, Dr Bhag Mal was also assigned the responsibility to assist Director, NBPGR to execute a mega Indo-USAID Project which entailed construction of the National Gene Bank at New Delhi, Medium-term Storage Facilities in ten different agro-climatic zones of the country, provision of polyhouses and training of entire scientific and technical staff. Flawless execution of this project is fondly remembered even after twenty-five years of completion of the project.

In the end, I would like to mention that Dr Bhag Mal is, without doubt, 'too good' a person and a professional. It was an honour to have been associated with Dr Bhag Mal. I wish and pray for his good health and look forward to his continued guidance in future.

I wish Dr Bhag Mal great health, happiness and long life.



t is my proud privilege to write something about Dr Bhag Mal ji with whom I was associated at the ICAR-IGFRI, Jhansi in 1969 except for a few years when he left Jhansi and joined at Amravati. His dynamic leadership, helping attitude and positive approach is definitely unforgettable. I worked as Research Assistant with him when he was Assistant Plant Improvement Officer (Grasses) where I found his dedication towards his duties, and friendly behaviour with everybody. After 3-4 years, he left IGFRI and joined as Junior Botanist at the ICAR-IARI Regional Centre, Amravati (Maharashtra) but after a few years, he again came back to IGFRI Jhansi as Senior Plant Breeder and again I worked with him. Bhag Mal: My Personal Reflection

rassland and fodder research has traditionally been associated with a sustainable livestock production in the country. It is in this context that I have had my first interaction with Dr Bhag Mal.

It gives me great pleasure to be writing today about Dr Bhag Mal whom I have known now for the past several decades. The research institute at Jhansi used to come under the domain of Animal Sciences at the Indian Council of Agriculture Research headquarters in New Delhi. There were several occasions when the fodder situation in the country particularly with respect to our drylands would be discussed across the table. It was always found that Dr Bhag Mal was not only aware of the situation on ground but had a grasp of the problems and understood challenges which the livestock population in the country faced in terms of feed and fodder availability. 



My best wishes to Dr Bhag Mal, on his 80th birthday and I wish him good health and all the best for his continuous services to agricultural science!



never thought a day will ever come in my life when I will be asked to write a few words about a person whom I have seen all the time carrying fragrance of simplicity with rays of smile, sincerity, utmost commitment to the work and full of actions.

I came in contact with Dr Bhag Mal almost three decades back in the year 1987 when he joined the ICAR-NBPGR as Project Coordinator, All India Coordinated Research Project on Underutilized and Underexploited Crops' and additionally looking after the implementation of Indo-USAID PGR project operations at the NBPGR. I used to interact with him more often in connection of implementing the PGR Database Management project (a sub-project of the Indo-USAID project). It is a coincidence that I used to sit in a computer lab just adjacent to Dr Bhag Mal's chamber. Whenever I had any doubt/ clarification/ problem related to the project, I used to rush to Dr Bhag Mal's room without any hesitation, thinking he can only take me out of the hot water. r Bhag Mal has reached to the age of 80 years on April 1, 2022. I am sure that many of his contemporary colleagues must have mentioned his numerous contributions what he made during his career with great significance and relevance to Indian agriculture, therefore, I will not venture into attempting and repeat the same here. When I discussed with Dr Bhag Mal about this, he listened everything with cool and calm and gave me some suggestions to follow, which worked also and we completed the task well in time. I learnt a lot from him that how one can have perseverance of high level and deliver too. When he was President of the Indian Society of Plant Genetic Resources (ISPGR) almost similar experience I had while working with him as General Secretary of ISPGR to organize a National Symposium.

Whenever I went to meet Dr Bhag Mal, I observed that he is always busy either in reading, writing or editing wherever he worked or works. He is extremely simple, easy-to-approach and a gentleman kind personality. I have not seen much change in him physically and in his simplicity over the years.

r Bhag Mal and I had served the ICAR in different capacities and retired in almost nearest years, but still we had to wait for our post-retirement days for an opportunity to meet each other and work together. Post-retirement Dr Bhag Mal joined the Delhi office of Bioversity International (formerly IPGRI, the International Plant Genetic Resources Institute, Rome) as the South Asia Coordinator and I as Advisor of Biodiversity in the MS Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF), Chennai. These roles provided us a stage for close working for about a decade along with Dr Stefano Padulosi of IPGRI, who was the International Coordinator of a project supported by International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), Rome and located in South Asia, Yemen, Egypt and South America. This project on different neglected crops laid focus on small millets in South Asia, involving India and Nepal. The leadership and coordination of the South Asian project component was entrusted with me on behalf of the MSSRF. The South Asian project partners, apart from MSSRF, included two multidisciplinary teams in the Agricultural Universities in Bengaluru and Dharwad in India and Nepal Agricultural Research Council (NARC), Kathmandu and Li-Bird, Pokhara, in Nepal.

This project on 'Enhancing the Contribution of Nutritive but Neglected Crops to Food Security and Incomes of the Rural Poor' had a comprehensive approach. In South Asia, it included enhancing productivity of minor millets through quality seed and improved agro-techniques, promoting crop diversity by farmer participatory seed selection, farmer preference to traditional and improved inter cropping system, and their empowerment to quality seed production. Post-harvest activities included deployment of simple







machineries to render drudgery-free threshing and grain processing, to facilitate value addition to improve bioavailability of these nutritious grains and opening opportunity for developing value added novel products and their marketing for increased farm income. Training and capacity building of farmers and farm women in agro-techniques, seed selection, quality seed production, operation of machineries, production of market driven value-added products and their marketing constituted other important aspect of this project. Two Indian teams of Home Science researchers from State Agricultural Universities in Bengaluru and Dharwad played important role in imparting several value added small millet products for home consumption as well as marketing hands on training on developing several value-added small millet products for home consumption as well as marketing.

This project provided me a close association with Dr Bhag Mal for about ten years during several field visits and interactions with farmers as well as the review of project progress on behalf of the funding agency (IFAD) by independent expert at all project sites and the annual review meetings at MSSRF, Nepal, Al Arish, Sanaa, and Rome. What impressed me the most about Dr Bhag Mal is his pleasing and jovial persona and forthright and incisive analysis of project outcome and practical solutions to technical issues concerned to project implementation by different partners. He was extremely helpful to the project team and highly appreciative of the achievements made by the team on minor millet productivity, value addition, marketing and over all farm income. I am proud to record that his guidance to the South Asian component of this project contributed to remarkable achievements at farm level, skilling the farmers, increased farm family consumption of value-added millet products and income from rural and urban marketing of these products.



Dr Bhag Mal: A Personality Ahead of Time


t is a great pleasure for me to prepare this write up on Dr Bhag Mal, a dear colleague and friend of mine, whom I met for the first time some 25 years ago in New Delhi, at the office of what was then the International Plant Genetic Resources Institute (IPGRI) (which later became Bioversity International and more recently the Alliance of Bioversity and CIAT). Great is my admiration and respect for Dr Bhag Mal for his scientific stature and his relentless commitment in making this a better world through the better use of agricultural biodiversity. Our common interest in the conservation and sustainable use of underutilized species, including wild and cultivated species, has been the driving force of a long cooperation at the time of my tenure as Senior Scientist at IPGRI/Bioversity, while coordinating the institutional research on neglected and underutilized species (NUS), a work which ended in 2019 in view of my retirement. In particular, Dr Bhag Mal provided unparalleled guidance in the implementation of two IFADfunded Projects, viz, Grant 533 and Grant 899, which ran from 2001 till 2005 and from 2007 till 2010, respectively. These were the very first UN funded projects dedicated to the promotion of NUS. India being one of the participating countries to such projects, numerous official missions that I undertook in South Asia together with Dr Bhag Mal, to visit projects sites or to pay courtesy calls to partner agencies, such as the MS Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF) in Chennai.

It brings with me fond memories of the time spent with him, during which we travelled for long hours to remote communities in Tamil Nadu, Odisha, Uttarakhand or even in Nepal, the other partner country involved in these efforts. In those unforgettable travels arranged in the strong and reliable Hindustan *Ambassador* cars, we interacted with farmers, women and men, local experts and technicians, renowned scientists (such as Prof MS Swaminathan), academicians, politicians and just simple community members, who were eager to share with us the challenges faced in growing millets or to seek advice in making the most out of their *orphan crops*. Such trips were source of unique learning and human growth to me, as I was able to witness the great wisdom held by farmers in India on how to recognize, cultivate and use local biodiversity, whose resilience to climate change is today recognized as one of the greatest assets for the future of humankind.

Dr Bhag Mal played a great role in forging with our partners, at all levels, a genuine trust which we hope to have paid back during the course of the projects' implementation, by providing them improved seeds and cultivation practices, enhanced marketing strategies, better processing technologies and cooking methods, raised awareness over the benefits of NUS, and in general, by supporting social growth, especially among the vulnerable groups, such as women and elderly people.







To this last point, I am indebted to Dr Bhag Mal for his gentle touch during our interactions with local communities, as he praised the hard work of women, stimulating their sense of self-esteem and contributing to ignite their personal and collective empowerment. Dr Bhag Mal is also a renowned prolific scientific writer and I am proud to have jointly written numerous papers, which I trust have contributed to raise the attention of decision makers, in India and elsewhere around the world, over the need for the greater safeguard, promotion and enhanced use of NUS.

I am very happy to see that Dr Bhag Mal has not been idle at all since he retired from IPGRI and on the contrary has been playing all along an active role in TAAS, in his capacity of Trustee and Secretary.

I am delighted to see that through his recent work, has contributed to promote further the knowledge on NUS for the benefit of the whole scientific community. I wish him many happy returns at the occasion of his 80th birthday!


APAARI sponsored National Workshop on Foresight and Future Pathways of Agricultural Research through Youth
